

As you already be aware, the Club will be holding our annual All-Day Meeting (ADM) on April 2, 2022. It will be held at the same location as our last ADM: Community Christian Church (623 Meramec Station Road, Ballwin, MO 63021). We'd like to do something that I believe the club will find interesting and generate a consensus on the flies we find most indispensable when fishing Missouri's trout waters. We are calling it "The Seven Flies".

The premise is this: if you had to rely on ONLY seven flies to fish in Missouri for 2022, what would those seven be? You must be specific with regards to fly color, key material, type/size hook, etc. In other words, don't just list 'woolie bugger'.

Tough Times for Trout on the North Fork of the White River

The North Fork of the White River (NFWR) in Ozark County, Missouri, boasts a "wild", or self-sustaining, rainbow trout population; the last stocking was in 1965. The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) designates the stretch from Rainbow and North Fork Springs to Patrick Bridge a Blue Ribbon Trout Management Area with potential for trophy-sized fish. Since 1967 brown trout have been stocked in the Red Ribbon section in the lower stretch of the river, upstream of where it warms and becomes Norfork Lake, created by a dam in northern Arkansas.

This NFWR was once listed by Trout Unlimited as one of The Best Trout Streams in the US. But there is consensus that now "the fishing is great, but the catching is poor". A "thousand year flood" in April, 2017 followed a period of torrential rain. The river rose almost 40 feet with an estimated flow rate of 200,000 cfs. Riparian dwellings were under water, and several were completely swept away downstream. Shade trees along the banks disappeared, and gravel was stripped from the bedrock. Earlier that year, a dam creating a millpond at Dawt was completely removed, after a child drowned when trapped in a breach of the dam which resulted from a flood in 2013.

MDC conducts electroshocking studies in several sections of the NFWR each fall. Since 2017, there has been a dramatic reduction in counts of Rainbow and Brown Trout in the Blue and Red Ribbon sections. High water and the damage to the Dawt Mill dam have allowed striped bass in Norfork Lake to migrate up the NFWR sine 2013.. The stripers have been seen far upstream from the trout areas. Very large schools of fish have been seen in pools along the river.

Some anglers have attributed the dwindling catch rates of trout to predation by the stripers. A guide told me that he has twice seen stripers attack rainbow trout. However, according to Nathan Recktenwald, Fisheries Management Biologist with the Missouri Department of Conservation, shad (also from Norfork Lake) and crayfish are the more common prey of choice for stripers. He also notes that fisherman do not commonly find trout in the stomachs of harvested stripers. Additional information provided by Mr. Recktenwald suggests that there are other isssues which negatively affect the trout population. Alarming changes in Ozark weather patterns have been documented by Missouri State University Professor Pavlowsky, Director of the Ozarks Environmental and Water Resources Institute.

The Ozark Plateau lies in a band which has been receiving much heavier rainfall in the spring and fall. Consider the following data:

A 37% increase in heavy precipitation in Missouri in recent years
An 8-fold increase in days with more than 3 inches of rain in Big Barren Creek since 2015

A 2-8% increase PER YEAR in peak annual flow rate in Ozark streams since 1990

The effect on Ozark streams is widening, bank erosion, and increased sediment, adversely affecting trout habitat. In fact, the MDC has concluded that flooding has diminished the effect of Brown Trout stocking not only in the NFWR, but Lake Taneycomo, the Meramec River, and Roubidoux Creek. High flows, flash floods, and heat stress are likely other contributing factors.

The future of the trout population in the NFWR is uncertain. Supplemental stocking of rainbow trout has been considered but deferred for now. Anecdotally, the smallmouth bass population is thriving, despite the adverse state of the trout. It will probably take years for the trout population to reach a new equilibrium.
