
January Meeting



Fly of the Month - January 2022

Thin Mint Wooley Bugger

They say there is no wrong way to fish a wooley bugger, or wrong color to tie one. I've also been told you can tie it any color you want as long as it has peacock in it. This one has everything a proper bugger needs with the added bonus of color contrasts from a layered marabout tail of olive, brown, and black. As with any bugger, it can be tied from size 4 down to a 10 and unweighted all the way to a tungsten cone head versions – even jigged versions.

Tying Materials

Hook: Standard Streamer Hook #4 - #10

Bead: Appropriately-Sized Tungsten in Gold or Black

Weight: .020 Lead Wire

Thread: 8/0 Black

• Tail: Olive, Brown, and Black Marabou

• Flash: Rootbeer Crystal Flash

Ribbing: Small Copper Wire

Body: Peacock Herl

Hackle: Brown or Brown Dyed Grizzly Saddle Hackle

Tying Steps

- 1. Place bead on hook and secure hook in vise. Add 6 -10 wraps of lead wire to hook and shove up against the bead.
- 2. Start the thread just behind the lead wraps and wrap thread to the bead and back to secure the lead wraps. Advance thread to the hook bend.
- 3. Make a tail using the three colors of marabou with the olive on the bottom, brown in the middle, and the black on top. The length should be the length of the hook shank. Use the marabou butts to build a level underbody up to the lead wraps.
- 4. Tie in two lengths of crystal flash on each side of the tail and trim to just longer than the marabou.
- 5. Tie in a section of copper wire and 3-5 peacock herl stems leaving the thread at the hook bend.
- 6. Twist the thread and peacock together to form a rope and wrap the peacock rope to the bead and tie off with thread wraps. Trim the peacock ends.
- 7. Prepare a saddle hackle feather by stripping off the non-usable fluff and web from the shaft. Tie hackle feather in by the base just behind the bead. Wrap the hackle in evenly spaced spiral to the base of the tail. Using the wire, make 2 wraps across the tip of the hackle to secure the end then spiral wrap the wire through the hackle fibers to just behind the bead and secure with thread wraps.
- 8. Apply cement to thread and whip finish.

I fish this by casting upstream and across letting it sink like a nymph, and then swinging it across and down stream at the end of the drift. I have seen it fished as a nymph under an indicator and tied on a jig hook and fished as the heavy point fly on a Euronymph rig. It fishes equally well for a variety of fish from trout to bluegill to smallmouth bass. Like any bugger, you cannot fish it wrong.
