Fly of the Month – February 2020

Trigger Spot Pheasant Tail Nymph

I've been experimenting with hot spot nymphs for a while now – Listening to theories about visual appeal, contrast, UV reflectivity, curiosity, and even egg-sucking nymphs. Whatever the reason, fish do respond to hot spots on even very simple nymphs. This variation on a simple pheasant tail nymph moves the hot spot from the tail or the collar and puts it on the back where an emerging may fly's wing case would be - Thus the trigger spot.

Materials

- Hook: Your Favorite Scud Hook #16-18
- Bead: 3/32 Nickel Black
- Thread: Veevus 12/0 Brown
- Tail: Pheasant Tail Fibers
- Ribbing: Small Copper Wire
- Body: Pheasant Tail Fibers
- Thorax: Peacock Herl
- Wing Case: Pheasant Tail Fibers
- Hot Spot: UV Hot Pink Dubbing

Tying Steps

- 1. Place bead on hook and secure hook in vise. Start thread behind the bead and advance to hook bend.
- 2. Tie in several pheasant tail fibers for a tail about the length of the body.
- 3. Tie in a length of copper wire for ribbing.
- 4. Wrap the pheasant tail fibers forward to form a thin body to the half-way point of the hook shank. Tie off and trim excess.
- 5. Counter wrap the wire to the thorax. Tie off and trim excess.
- 6. Tie in several pheasant tail fibers by the tips on top of the thorax area.
- 7. Tie in 1 or 2 peacock herl and advance the thread to behind the bead.
- 8. Wrap peacock herl to the bead, secure with thread wraps, and trim excess.
- 9. Pull the wing case over the thorax, tie off with several thread wraps, and trim excess.
- 10. Dub a very small, tight ball of UV Hot Pink dubbing and push down on top of the fly collar. Make one or two thread wraps keeping all the dubbing right on top of the collar. Whip finish and trim the thread.

I fish this as a dropper under a small dry fly or as the dropper on my nymph rig. Few flies produce as consistently as a pheasant tail nymph and all its variations. This one is just a little more special and it often makes a big difference. Experiment with hot spot colors as well.

More About Simon

As mentioned on Page 1, our February All-Day Meeting Guest Speaker is Simon Gawesworth.

Simon's father, well known fly fishing instructor and author, John Gawesworth, taught him to fish at the age of 8 and he's been teaching fly casting professionally since the age of 16. With over 35 years of teaching experience, Simon is a highly soughtafter instructor. He has written three books on Spey casting.

He has both cast and fished for England in British, European and World Championships and was elected Captain of the England team for the 2003 World Fly Fishing Championship.

Simon is A.P.G.A.I. and S.T.A.N.I.C. certified in the U.K. and C.I., Master



and T.H.C.I. certified in the U.S. through Fly Fishers International. In 2019 Simon was the recipient of the Lifetime Teaching Award by Fly Fishers International.

With the collapse of the British Casting Authority and the tournament casting scene in the UK, Simon turned his hand to competitive fly fishing. Over the following years Simon represented England in three home internationals (against Ireland, Scotland and Wales), two European championships and five World Championships, culminating in the prestige of becoming the England Team Captain and Manager for the 2003 World Championships in Spain.

During his career Simon has written numerous articles for the fishing press, published two books on spey casting, presented five instructional videos and DVD's, appeared on numerous television and radio shows, demonstrated casting at fly fishing shows around the world and is recognized as one of the leading authorities on fly casting and fly casting instruction. Simon's latest book, entitled Single Handed Spey Casting has just been published by Stackpole Books.

He is a Master and THCI (Two Handed Casting Instructor) certified instructor and also holds the APGAI and STANIC diplomas for Fly Fishing Instruction in the UK.

Simon works for RIO products in Idaho where he designs and tests fly lines, as well as being the marketing manager for RIO. He conducts fly casting classes and seminars around the world. Simon is acknowledged as one of the world's leading authorities on Spey casting and has taught and demonstrated spey casting around the world.

The fly-fishing blog, *Flydreams* has an extensive interview with Simon available on their site.

In addition, the site Ask About Fly Fishing has a podcast episode with Simon you can listen to.
