New Book Club


Fly Fishing and Leadership: Lessons from the Stream

Fly of the Month – October 2021 Itty Meaty Thing

Fall and winter bring some of the best opportunities for big trout – its streamer time. But you don't have to invest in an 8-weight power-stick and 500-grain sinking line to throw mega-articulated chicken-sized flies to be successful. Leeches work and are much more user-friendly.

This one works especially well if you are getting into the tight-line nymphing systems. It offers a great jigging action, a lot of movement, and a great silhouette. I found the Itty Meaty Thing at a small fly shop while the creator and tyer was delivering a load for late season fishing.

Tying Materials

- Hook: Gamakatsu Octopus #8-12
- Bead: Black Tungsten of appropriate size
- Weight: .020 Lead wire
- Thread: 8/0 Black
- Tail: Black Rabbit Zonker Strip (could use Squirrel strip for smaller sizes)
- Body: UV Black Simi-Seal dubbing and Dyed Black Pheasant Rump
- Collar: Black-Dyed Pheasant Rump

Tying Steps

- Slide bead onto hook and secure in vise. Back-load the bead with 5 or 6 wraps of lead wire shoved up tight to the bead.
- Start thread just behind the lead wraps. Secure lead wraps with thread up to the bead and then wrap back to a point adjacent to the hook barb – not the hook bend. This is a short shank hook with a wide gap so the geometry is different.
- 3. Tie in a section of rabbit zonker strip about twice the hook shank length.
- 4. Form a dubbing loop then wrap thread to the bead.
- 5. Fill the loop with a loose amount of UV Black Simi-Seal and 1 Black-Dyed Pheasant Rump feather stripped of fluff and laid in tip-up along the center stem. Spin up your dubbing loop while brushing the fibers out. Make sure you don't up too much material or it will be too bulky.
- 6. Wrap the body while brushing the material to the rear all the way to the bead and secure. Trim excess.
- 7. Tie in another pheasant rump feather by the tip and make 1 wrap to form a collar.
- 8. Whip-finish thread and trim excess.

They also tie and sell this fly in gray, olive, and black/olive. If you don't have dyed pheasant, try using natural colors – it gives the fly a mottled effect that seems to work just as well. I fish this on a tight line jigging it through likely runs or up against sharp banks or logs.

I have also fished it under an indicator with success. I have not really had a lot of success swinging it, though, but it looks great in the water fished that way. Early fall or late spring, I use the larger sizes, while the smaller sizes work best in winter.
