

One of Al Bourisaw's most long-lasting contributions to Ozark Fly Fishers, was his survey of effective Missouri Trout Flies. The 25 flies are meant to be used for fishing for trout and have been identified for the State of Missouri; but as anyone who has fished in other areas will testify, the selection can be used in most places that trout are found. Don't be afraid to take some of these patterns along to that trip out West or back East.

The list has been compiled from a survey conducted by the Ozark Fly Fishers of its membership and is provided in alphabetical order. The survey was taken in 2009 so the list is current. However, the sampling consisted of only a small percent of the entire membership. There was nothing scientific about the survey and only can be taken at face value. Trout Beads

Say what you will, but trout are opportunistic feeders and will take advantage of the most available food. I Missouri, our hatchery stocked rainbows are actually two different strains – one that spawns in the spring and one that spawns in the fall. That way the hatcheries always have a steady supply of spawning fish. That's one reason egg flies – Y2K's, Glow Bugs, etc. – will always be a good option for at least an attractor fly and very often be your main fish-catcher fly. They are an instinctive reflex food item that yields great food value for the energy expended.

After trips to Michigan and Alaska, I am impressed by the resourcefulness of fly anglers and the evolution of trout beads as a trout/salmon egg imitation. While I have not seen them to a great extent here in Missouri, it continues to evolve. I have seen them on Lake Tanneycomo in the fall and have produced some great fish. The key in Steelhead, Salmon, and Rainbow fishing in getting the size and color right and the rigging. Most fly shops that carry trout beads stock anything from 3mm up to 12mm beads in a rainbow of colors.

The larger sizes imitate salmon-sized eggs while smaller sizes imitate rainbow-sized eggs. I do see people fishing gigantic glowballs in our trout parks with great success, but I still prefer to fish smaller egg flies when possible. The colors of the fish eggs also change depending on the spawning fish and the time in the water after they are laid. Every steelhead, rainbow, and salmon guide have their own secret special method of picking out the perfect bead color, but the best advice is to

get a wide assortment of colors in 3 sizes – 3mm, 6mm, and 8mm. That should cover all your bead needs. Ideally, you can look at the eggs in the water and choose your size and color. In Missouri, however, that may be difficult. The only real problem with the beads is that the fish are gobbling down eggs with such abandon that fish mortality was a real issue, so proper rigging is really important.

Rigging beads is also an art form rather than a science. Everyone seems to have a favorite system that has its advantages and disadvantages. One of the most ingenious systems used about 8 feet of 15-pound mono leader with a loop on the end and a pretty large strike indicator at the top, then looped on a 12-inch piece of 12 pound fluorocarbon tippet with the bead threaded on and the hook tied on. They took a section of 15-pound mono and tied a stop knot just above the hook to keep the bead off the hook. That made bead changes super easy. Obviously, I would use much lighter leader and tippet for here in Missouri, but you get the idea. The split shot should tick the bottom while the bead tumbles along the bottom. When the fish takes the bead, setting the hook pulls the bead out of their throat and hooks them in the jaw. It's almost cheating. It's almost not fly fishing, but it is definitely matching the hatch when the fish are keying on eggs and nothing else will work. I can't wait to try it here in Missouri.
